Our Mission

Rebuilding communities affected by leprosy and disability, as part of a national consortium of Civil Society Organisations partnering with the Government.

In India, we started in 1998

To carry out leprosy control activities under Dr Ekambaram's leadership (Eminent Leprologist 1917-2003). Our initial focus was on early detection, treatment, disability limitation and care to affected people. In recent years we have added a greater focus on community.

We aim to carry forward Raoul Follereau's approach of sharing love while serving people with leprosy, within families and communities. He was a French social reformer (1903-1977) instrumental in founding a number of organisations; and was the inspiration for the establishment of AIFO.

Renewed hope and efforts - in the face of the Covid pandemic

Children and adults affected by leprosy face innumerable challenges every single day. Starting with difficulty accessing basic necessities like food and medical care extending to acquiring education or finding a sustaining livelihood. Social stigma creates severe trauma in daily living.

Covid and lockdowns added many more hurdles this year.

While we have continued our Leprosy support work in the North-East, we are 'grateful to have also received support from individuals, associations, companies, and volunteers for our Covid response. AIFO India has reached varied communities in Karnataka and the North-East with survival kits to migrant workers, remote tribal groups, leprosy affected and stranded families.

- 25,000+ young adults supported to earn sustainable incomes
- 1115 Self Help Groups facilitated, which have 15,614 members, including 6,864 Persons with disabilities

With Leprosy affected people we have worked both directly and with valued aligned partners including the government in 8 states of the North-East and Karnataka.

As a member of the International Anti-Leprosy Federation we are also actively involved in contributing to new policies and programmes.
